Key Focus 1: Improving whole school health

Evaluation					
<p>The school has a large playing field and wooded area. Due to British weather conditions it had previously been out of use for a number of months, however this is no longer the case and for the last 4 years the field is used consistently, resulting in very few wet play and lunchtimes. Waterproof trousers have been replaced as the original ones took quite a hit they were used so much! In previous discussion with staff it was felt that there were lost opportunities for using the outside learning environment to its full potential. Therefore for the last 2 years there has been an expectation that it is used to promote learning and is planned in for a minimum of once a term, now moving to at least twice a term. The planning is collected by the headteacher. The changes introduced have become embedded: the children being asked to bring in wellington boots so that they can go on the field at lunchtime ; children who wish to play football can bring in a change of clothes and shoes and the use of the wooded area - allowing the children to access this with staff at lunchtime.</p> <p>The school always makes full use of the Tesco and Sainsbury voucher schemes and uses them to replace and update sports equipment.</p> <p>We continue to provide each year group with their own football for football, netball or basketball.</p> <p>The old netball posts have been replaced.</p> <p>Last year the school purchased an outdoor classroom, which is also used as an area for shade during hot weather and a shelter from the rain. At the same time a trim trail was installed on the field which can be added to over time.</p> <p>Following confirmation that the DfE have doubled the sports Premium allocation for schools towards addressing and improving Whole School Health the school will focus its attention primarily on this area this year.</p>
